What is Libraries of Oregon?

Libraries of Oregon is a website that connects Oregon residents to statewide library resources and local public libraries. Website visitors can access databases that house articles, video clips, podcasts, and images from encyclopedias, newspapers, and magazines or use the 24/7 ask-a-librarian service to satisfy their information needs. These subscription databases, which are not freely available on the internet, and the ask-a-librarian service are paid for with federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) funds administered by the Oregon State Library. Oregon public libraries offer these same resources locally, and you can use this website's library locator to find your nearest public library.

What kind of resources can I access?

- Popular magazine articles
- Research journal articles
- Newspaper articles
- Digitized special collections from Oregon colleges and universities
- Job skills development tools
- 24/7 chat, e-mail, or text with a librarian

What kind of questions can I ask a librarian?

- Help with homework and research projects
- Information you need to do projects like gardening, woodworking, or car repair
- Answers to quick questions like “What is the capital of Iran?”, “What movie won best picture at the Oscars in 1975?”, or “What was the average price of Xerox stock in 1980?”
- Book recommendations for you, your children, other family members, and friends
- Locations and contact information for local businesses, restaurants, shops, and other community resources you need to find
- Ask any question!
